Introducing "Sustainable Development Goals in Journalism Reporting"

The "SDGsJR" project aims to develop a journalism curriculum in line with sustainable development, and to increase the knowledge of faculty staff in ICT-based teaching methodologies.



The project

The "Sustainable Development Goals in Journalism Reporting" is a 36-month project, co-funded by the Erasmus+ Programme of the European Commission.

It is implemented by a consortium of nine (9) partners from five (6) countries: Spain, Romania, Luxembourg, Cambodia, China and Malaysia.

The project aims to increase the capacity of academic staff in Partner Countries' HEIs. Academic staff will be trained in teaching the new specialized course. This will aid them in developing a journalism curriculum that is current with the latest climate change and sustainable development developments. They will be involved throughout the project's life cycle, including activities such as needs analysis, study visits, knowledge exchange, and the development of a new course program. Second, faculty members (academics, lecturers, and researchers) will receive online training in innovative ICT-based teaching methodologies as well as learning about best practices in EU-HEIs.

All the project's activities revolve around the idea of developing a course program in HEIs that is long-term sustainable and linked to the needs of the labor market and society at large.



The objectives

The Project aims to achieve four main objectives:

- Improvement of the quality of Higher Education and Life-Long Learning skills for high-quality media reporting on SDGs and ICT-based data analysis.
- Enhancement of the current relevance to the labor market and journalism studies.
- Improvement of the level of competences and skills in the HEIs by developing new and innovative journalism reporting course.
- Promotion of transnational cooperation in the field of media reporting on SDGs and ICT-based data analysis.
